You will need a phone number to call in (it MAY be a long distance number,) then put in the meeting ID number, and a passcode (aka meeting password), followed by the #_key. Ask your Calling Committee person for the required numbers. At least give it a try! We miss you all!

Once you are connected, you will be prompted to press *6 to unmute yourself.

NEW ART MOVEMENT IN RED BLUFF

Tehama Creative is a group of artists who are creating a new public art movement in Red Bluff. The group showcases local artists works, partnering with local businesses in creating murals on their buildings to engage the community and tourists in the public art experience.

Beginning with a small group of artists' need to network spending time creating together, it quickly grew into a broader community project now known as Art Alley in Red Bluff. Vibrant murals line the alley behind the Copy Center and behind Los Mariachis Restaurant in Red Bluff, providing a unique experience with each mural presenting its story. Another large mural is in Antelope's Frontier Village and a second one can be view from Rio St. on the Masonic Lodge building. It has been found that the walls with murals are less likely to be defaced with graffiti.
